

Neighborhood Centers

The Parks & Recreation Department has two neighborhood centers and two buildings in the parks available for use by civic organizations, and for family reunions, club meetings, and receptions.

ECRA Runway

The former runway located at the south end of the East Crawford Recreation Area is available to use for events and activities based upon the following fee structure:

FOR NON-PROFIT USES (\$100 deposit for each event):

1. Direct costs incurred by the City for labor/equipment to provide services - barricades, bleachers, trash cans, etc.

FOR PROFIT EVENTS (\$100 deposit for each event):

1. Direct costs incurred by the City for labor/equipment to provide services - barricades, bleachers, trash cans, etc.
2. \$100 for each setup day(s)
\$150 for each day(s) of event
\$100 per day(s) clean-up/tear-down

Additional fees may be charged for any costs related to additional clean-up, turf damage, etc., incurred by the City of Salina. All users are required to fill out a permit application to reserve the runway. For more information, contact Parks & Recreation at 309-5765.

Skate Board Park

The Kevin Voll Skate Park opened July 1997, and is located in Centennial Park. Features at the Park include Steel Quarter Pipe, Steel Trick Pipe, Concrete 3-Sided Pyramid, Ollie Box, Authentic Handrail, 24" Launch Ramp, and Rail Slide. The Park is open year-round, weather permitting, during park hours. In 2002, lighting for evening use and more ramps and jumps in the center of the park were added.

Disc Golf Course

Frisbee fans will want to try their hand at this game. The 18-hole course features two 9-hole layouts in the north and south ends of Lakewood Park. The course consists of tee signs describing layout, distance and par for each hole, tee boxes, and the disc pole hole targets. Rules are similar to regular golf and are posted at the start of the course.

Municipal Golf Course

Salina's public 18-hole golf course, located at the East Crawford Recreation Area, 841 Markley Rd., is one of the more popular public facilities in Kansas. This par 70 course was rated a 3-3/4 star rating (out of a possible 5 star) by Golf Digest Magazine. Slope rating is 117 with a course rating of 70.9 for men, 71.3 for ladies. Our 6-hole Par 3 First Tee course opened in 2001.

Bicycle/Pedestrian Path

In April 1993, the City of Salina was awarded a grant from the KS Department of Transportation for construction of a biking/jogging path on the flood control levee in the east part of town. This project was funded 80% by KDOT's Transportation Enhancement Program and 20% by City of Salina funds. Totaling 3.1 miles from Bill Burke Park to Magnolia Road, the path is constructed of crushed limestone screenings on the levee and along the river in Bill Burke Park, and reinforced concrete along and under the Crawford Street bridge. Completed in the fall of 1995, this community project provides excellent transportation and recreation opportunities for pedestrians, joggers, and bicyclists. Additional path entry points are available in Oxbow Park and on East Cloud Street. All users are asked to observe the posted rules.
