

Disposal Guidelines

- The HHW facility only accepts residential materials.
- Schools and non-profit organizations from Saline County use the same guidelines that apply to households. A signed *Certification of Generator Status* is also required.
- Small businesses may contact K-State's *Small Business Environmental Assistance Program* (SBEAP) at **800-578-8898** or sbeap@ksu.edu for assistance with disposal options.
- There is a weekly disposal limit of 50 pounds or 5 gallons per household.
- Do not combine materials; some items aren't compatible with each other and produce dangerous fumes; other items when combined may not be recyclable.
- Pack wastes in sturdy containers, such as a tub or box, for transportation; avoid plastic garbage bags, unless used to line a tub or box.
- Make sure products are accurately and legibly labeled and lids are tight.
- Empty containers and solidified latex paint may be disposed of with your household trash with lids removed.
- Wrap leaking containers in a clean plastic bag or pack them in a container with an absorbent material such as kitty litter.
- Transport materials in your automobile trunk or truck bed.
