Along with \$30,000 in KDOT matching funds and \$10,000 local funds, the total consulting services agreement amount to be scoped will be \$200,000.

### GRANT AGREEMENT UNDER THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL GRANT PROGRAM

This agreement is between the United States Department of Transportation (the "USDOT") Federal Highway Administration (the "FHWA") and the City of Salina (the "Recipient").

This agreement reflects the selection of the Recipient to receive a Safe Streets and Roads for All ("SS4A") Grant for the Saline County and City of Salina Safety Action Plan.
