


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RECREATION SCHOLARSHIPS

REFUND POLICY

Program Registration:

For persons wishing to cancel their registration for any activity sponsored by our department, a full refund will be issued if staff is given at least 72 hours prior to the start of the activity. If notice is given greater than 24 hours and less than 72 hours prior to the start of the activity, a 50% cancellation fee will be withheld and the remaining amount will be refunded or credited to the user account. Notices given less than 24 hours prior to the start of the activity, or a participant's failure to show, will not be eligible for a refund. Extenuating circumstances will be reviewed and handled on a case-by-case basis.

Facility Reservations:

For persons wishing to cancel their facility reservation will need to notify the Salina Parks and Recreation office at least 2 weeks prior to the reservation to receive a full refund of the rental fee. If cancelled within 2 weeks of the event, a 50% cancellation fee will be withheld and the remaining amount of the fee will be refunded or credited to the user account. No refund will be offered due to failure to notify Salina Parks and Recreation or non-use of facility. Extenuating circumstances will be reviewed and handled on a case-by-case basis.

Trips and Tours

For trips with a registration deadline, cancellations will be accepted and a full refund will be issued prior to the registration deadline. Cancellations that occur after the registration deadline will require a replacement person in order to receive a full refund. Openings will be filled from an established waiting list.

If no replacement participant is available, persons who wish to cancel their registration after the deadline will only be eligible for a pro-rated credit to the user account. The credit amount will be equal to the actual, per person fees recovered by staff including any non-refundable deposits or ticket purchases.

For those trips with no registration deadline, cancellations will be addressed in the same way as described above. However, all refund requests will be handled on a case-by-case basis, with the amount to be determined by the timing of the request and the refund policy of each specific trip destination. Extenuating circumstances will be reviewed and handled on a case-by-case basis.

Adult Summer Softball



Dogs must remain on a leash while not in the water. Humans are expected to clean up after their dogs. No Dangerous dogs as outlined by the City Ordinance passed August 9, 2004 shall be allowed. SWIM LESSONS

Swim Lessons

The Salina Parks & Recreation Department is offering morning and evening swim lessons for the 2024 Summer season at Kenwood Cove Aquatic Park.

The preqrequisite for each class level is the successful demonstration of the skills taught in the previous level. We currently do not have a record of swimclass history. Beginners start at Level I, which does not have a skill prerequisite, however, the minimum age is 5.

To provide safe, age-appropriate activities, the Learn to Swim program is hesitant to make exceptions to age designations. Class sizes are limited in order to provide high-quality instruction and experience. Water safety staff reserve the right to change class placement for students to assure that they are receiving the proper level of instruction. Students are limited to once class per session.

Swim Lessons - Infant/Toddler with Parent

This course will help young children become comfortable in, on and around the water so that when the time comes, they are ready to learn how to swim. The instructor will introduce new swimming and water safety skills that are developmentally appropriate and engaging for infants and young children.

It is important to understand that Parent and Child Aquatics is not designed to teach children to become good swimmers or even to survive in the water on their own. This class introduces you and your child to basic skills. As parents, you learn how to safely work with your child in the water, including how to appropriately support and hold your child in the water and how to prepare and encourage your child to participate fully and try the skills. In addition, you are introduced to several water safety topics. Your child receives an introduction to basic skills that lay a foundation for learning to swim. An adult - it could be a parent, guardian or caregiver - is required to accompany each child in thewater and participate in every class. The adult participants learn too!

SWIM LESSONS

Swim Lessons - Preschool

For each level of Preschool Aquatics, our instructors follow a plan to introduce new swimming and water safety skills that are developmentally appropriate for young children. Preschool Aquatics puts the "fun" in fundamentals. Each class is loaded with enjoyable, engaging and challenging activities that motivate children to want to perform and learn to swim. In Preschool Aquatics Level 1, your child is introduced to basic skills. These skills lay the foundation for developing water competency and the future skill development of swimming strokes. In addition, your child starts to develop positive attitudes and safe practices around the water. In Preschool Aquatics Level 2, your child continues to lay the foundation for developing water competency and further skill development. This level marks the beginning of independent aquatic locomotion skills. Children continue to explore using simultaneous and alternating arm and leg actions on the front and back to gain greater proficiency in preparation for performing strokes. Preschool Aquatics Level 3 is for young children who are more independent in the water. New swimming skills and water safety skills are introduced to further the child's development of water competency stills are introduced to further the child's development of water competency preparing them for learn to swim classes.

SWIM LESSONS

Swim Lessons (Levels 1 - 6)

Our Water Safety staff will determine the level your child will be in on the first day by age and skill level. After the first day of class your child will be in a set class for the rest of the session.

For every level of Learn-to-Swim, our instructors follow a plan to introduce new swimming and water safety skills and build on previously learned skills.

Each class is loaded with fun, engaging and challenging activates that motivate children to want to perform and learn to swim. It is common for children to participate in several sessions of a level before they successfully demonstrate each skill. That is okay! It is not important how quickly they move through a level, but that they acquire each skill.

Level 1 - Introduction to Water Skills, your child is introduced to basic skills as the foundation for future skills and the development of water competency (the basic minimum skills needed for water safety).

Level 2 - Fundamental Aquatic Skills builds on skills learned in Level 1. Your child begins to perform skills at a slightly more advanced level and begins gaining rudimentary propulsive skills on both the front and the back. This level marks the beginning of independent aquatic locomotion skills.

Level 3 - Stroke Development builds on skills learned in previous levels. Your child learns to swim the front crawl and elementary backstroke at rudimentary levels, is introduced to the scissors and dolphin kicks, learns the survival float and increases the time duration for treading water. Your child also learns the rules for headfirst entries and begins to learn to enter the water headfirst from a seated position at the poolside in 9 feet deep water or deeper.

Level 4 - Stroke Improvement works on improving the swimming stroke proficiency and swimming for longer distances.

Level 5 - Stroke Refinement, the instructor follows a plan to refine all six swimming strokes including swimming for longer distances. The expectations are higher in regards to distance and quality.

Level 6 - This level is split into two sections that the participant can pick from; Personal Water Safety or Fitness Swimmer.

Friends of the Animal Shelter:

The Friends of the Salina Animal Shelter is a non-profit volunteer organization that is dedicated to helping the animals at the Salina Animal Shelter. These volunteers brighten the lives of the many pets cared for at the shelter daily. Volunteers are an integral part of getting the animals socialized, keeping them exercised, and getting them exposure to the public all with the hopes of finding all the shelter animals new furr-ever homes and furr-ever families!

Foster Parents:

Foster homes feed, care, train, socialize and most importantly love shelter animals. The need for more foster families is ever present as every day more animals are being released to the shelter.

Foster parents take in sick or injured dogs and cats needing quiet space and extra attention as well as expectant and nursing moms with their puppies and kittens.

The TLC given in foster care, in addition to the extra space foster families provide, allow for fewer animals to be euthanized.

Serving Saline County

The Salina Animal Shelter is now providing services to the Saline County outside the City of Salina. If you find a stray dog or domesticated cat in the county you can drop it at the shelter so that it can receive the care it deserves. The Salina Animal Shelter will also accept owner surrenders from Saline County residents for adoption.

Dog Park

The City of Salina has two public dog parks; Barkley Park, and the Salina Animal Shelter Dog Park. Barkley Park is a fully fenced, 2-acre public dog park located South of Dean Evans Stadium on Markley Rd, and is open to the public daily from 5am to 12am. A second, smaller dog park is located at 329 N 2nd directly behind the Salina Animal Shelter to the west. This park is also open from 5am to 12am with the exception of a daily closure from 9am to 11am Monday through Friday. Your dog must be over 4 months of age and have a current rabies shot and city license (Salina residents only) to visit either park. Remember also keep your dog on a leash until you are inside the park.

Salina Trails

Located throughout the city, Salina Trails is a system of 24 miles of dedicated trails for pedestrians and bikers. Some of these trails are existing, some are planned and some are proposed for the future. Currently there are 13 miles of completed or planned trails and 11 miles of proposed trails. The trails can be divided into four different types: levee trails, multi-use, the Smoky Hill River Trail and Park nature/walking trails. Plus one mountain bike trail.

The Parks & Recreation Department has two neighborhood centers and two buildings in the parks available for use for civic organizations, family reunions, club meetings, and receptions. Potential users of the Eric Stein Stage and the Jerry Ivey Gazebo are required to fill out a facility request form to reserve these facilities. Park Restrooms

Seasonal restroom facilities are available at community parks and larger neighborhood parks. Restrooms are open early April until late October. Year-round heated restrooms are available in Oakdale Park, Jerry Ivey Park, Bill Burke Park, and Berkley Family Recreation Area.

Spray Grounds

There are water playgrounds at three different park sites. Located in Jerry Ivey Memorial, Centennial and Hawthorne Parks, the spray grounds have both in-ground and above-ground interactive features, built-in seating, and shade structures. These facilities will be open daily throughout warm weather months of May thru September, weather permitting.


